#### WINTER'S A GREAT TIME TO SAVE WATER INDOORS

Winter is here, bringing cooler days, shorter daylight hours and even some wet weather. When it's raining, conserving water may be the last thing that comes to mind. Yet, even normal or above-average snow and rainfall this winter is unlikely to erase four years of dry conditions. While we take a break from watering the lawn (letting Mother Nature water for us),

now is a great time to consider how to conserve water indoors.

- Install high-efficiency appliances such as toilets, showerheads, faucets, dishwashers and clothes washers
- Limit showers to five minutes or less
- Check plumbing and appliances for leaks and fix them within 48 hours
- Run the clothes washer and dishwasher only when full
- Turn off water when brushing teeth or shaving

#### HOLIDAY RECYCLING

As a reminder, the City collects garbage, green waste and recycling on all holidays so please place your cans out on your normal collection day.

Recycle holiday packaging materials by placing them in the blue recycling can. Acceptable items include wrapping paper, tissue, cardboard boxes, cards and other paper packaging materials. Please do not include foil-type wrapping paper and Styrofoam packaging. Bows and ribbons can be reused and Christmas trees can be cut and placed in green waste cans as long as the lid can completely close.

Take unwanted, bagged Christmas lights and excess packaging materials to the City's recycling drop-off bin located in the Walmart parking lot at 1018 Riley Street.

## Are You Ready for Storm Season?

The City of Folsom is preparing for winter storms, as predictions call for one of the strongest El Niños on record. The City is urging residents and businesses to get prepared now for powerful storms that could cause localized flooding, dangerous driving conditions and extended power outages.

- Clear your drains, rain gutters, and downspouts of debris.
- Consider obtaining flood insurance or checking your existing policy to make sure you have enough coverage.

- Make an emergency kit with flashlights, batteries, water, nonperishable food and other essentials in case of a power outage.
- If your property has a history of flooding, prepare your property with sand and sandbags in advance of the storm. The City has two sandbag stations and offers free sandbag materials next to Fire Station 36 at 9700 Oak Avenue Parkway and behind City Hall at 50 Natoma Street.
- Have an emergency plan in place. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) website www.ready.gov has valuable information on how you can prepare your family for an emergency.
- Report non-emergency stormrelated hazards to the City, such as localized flooding, fallen trees

- or limbs, and plugged storm drains by calling 355-8344.
- Traffic signals or street light outages and downed street signs can be reported from 7 a.m. to 3:30 P.M. by calling 355-8348.
   After hours, contact the Folsom Police Department dispatch line at 355-7231.
- Call 911 in the event of a storm-related emergency, such as a downed power line, downed trees on live wires, or a life-threatening emergency.
- Submit hazards through the City of Folsom's new online and mobile app Folsom Connect.
   Simply provide a location, description and a photo as you see the issue in real time.
