	After 120 month of City employment a retiree qualifies for dental and vision coverage. City funded portion depends on the number of years worked for The City of Folsom. City pays 50%-80% of premium.			
Life Insurance	\$60,000 policy paid by City for Unrepresented employee; \$2,000 for each eligible dependent. Accidental Death and Dismemberment: \$60,000.			
Disability Insurance	Short and long term disability paid by City with benefit of 60% salary up to age 65 for non-job related injuries or illnesses. (Current maximum of \$1,252 weekly for STD) Workers compensation insurance covers on-the-job injuries or illnesses.			
EAP	Employee assistance program (confidential); City pays \$2.12/mo.

Annual Leave	The City provides paid Annual Leave for use as vacation or sick time

Most staff work 40 hour workweeks, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. with a 1-hour lunch. Some classifications are allowed to work flexible scheduling, including a 9/80 work schedule of 9 hour days with every other Friday off.
