## WINTER IRRIGATION TIPS

Did you know that landscapes are our largest consumer of water? You can save a substantial amount of water by turning off your sprinklers when the rain begins. Cooler temperatures and shorter days mean less growth and additional watering is unnecessary. Seasonal rains will provide all the water needed. Too much water leads to shallow root growth and shallow roots lead to stressed landscapes and increased water use in the spring and summer. Need help? Contact the city's Water Conservation Team and schedule a free Water-Wise House Call—the water conservation experts will meet with you in person and help you determine the best way to water your landscaping. 

# FROM THE ARCHIVES: SUTTER STREET'S RICH HISTORY

The City of Folsom was incorporated in 1946, but the city's fascinating history dates back much further to the Gold Rush days. Today, you can get a taste of history in Folsom's revitalized Historic District. Enjoy dining, shopping, and nightlife while you soak up the historic architecture.

While the district offers visitors a glimpse into the city's past, many buildings have undergone multiple

transformations over time. As you stroll through the Historic District, keep in mind that you are surrounded by echoes of the past combined with thoughtful and prudent planning of the present.

## DID YOU KNOW?

815 Sutter Street, the building located next door to the Folsom History Museum, is not the first structure on the site. The original building that sat on that plot of land was the American Exchange Hotel, which was destroyed by fire in 1865. The hotel was rebuilt 10 years later and became a luxurious place to stay on the route to the gold and silver mines. Later, the building was the meeting place for the Native Sons of the Golden West, who used the building as their lodge hall and dance floor. Rubber supports were installed to produce a "spring effect" for dancing. Today, the building houses a number of favorite shops and businesses.

## CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

The city will hold its annual Christmas tree recycling drop-off event Saturday, January 7.

Trees will be accepted from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Rodeo Park at the end of Stafford Street. All ornaments, tinsel, lights, nails, and stands must be removed before dropping off a tree. The trees will be recycled and converted into compost, which adds nutrients into the soil and helps it to retain water. Flocked trees will not be accepted.

In addition, community organizations will collect trees throughout the city as part of their fundraising activities. Residents may also recycle Christmas trees in the green organics bin. Trees must be cut into pieces no larger than two feet in length and four inches in diameter, and the lid must close completely to receive service. Remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights, nails, and stands before placing in the green waste bin.

As a reminder, the city collects garbage, green waste, and recycling on all holidays, so place cans out on your normal collection day.

# PRESCHOOL OPEN HOUSES AND REGISTRATION

## AVOID COSTLY PRUNING MISTAKES THIS WINTER

Fallen leaves and exposed branches make winter the perfect time to prune and maintain trees. However, residents may unknowingly do more harm than good by implementing bad pruning practices—such as “tree topping.” Tree topping results in excessive canopy removal and leaves trunks with stubby limbs, which can ultimately lead to problems such as the tree’s death, weakened limbs falling on people or property, and increased long-term maintenance costs.

Tree topping is not allowed in the City of Folsom for any tree that is considered a protected tree—including native oak trees, privately-owned trees that are within 12.5 feet of the sidewalk or right-of-way, heritage trees, and trees

on commercial properties that were planted as part of the original development. Pruning or removal of any protected tree requires a City of Folsom tree permit. When you obtain a tree permit, the city arborist can provide guidance to help you protect your property and trees.

Homeowners can ensure their trees stay healthy by hiring a certified International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) arborist. Professional ISA certified arborists know how to properly maintain trees for both the health of the tree and public safety.
