TREE PRUNING TIPS

Prune young trees to establish good structure. Properly pruning trees when they are young can help avoid structural problems when trees are older.



FOLSOM TREE CARE AND FACTS

Trees provide measurable benefits to our neighborhoods, including cooler temperatures, cleaner air, higher property values, and healthier residents. The City of Folsom has been recognized by the Arbor Day Foundation as a Tree City USA for 16 years. The city is committed to the mission of environmental change and quality of life for our residents through growing and fostering a vibrant urban forest.

- The City of Folsom requires single family residential properties to have front yard street trees.
- A tree permit is required in order to remove or substantially prune a front yard tree. A replacement tree from the Folsom Master Tree List or otherwise approved by the city arborist must be planted in its place.
- The permit process also allows city staff the opportunity to provide you with guidance on proper and safe pruning practices. Visit www.folsom.ca.us/treepermits for more information.

HOW TO MAINTAIN YOUR WATER-EFFICIENT LANDSCAPE

- Water-efficient landscapes are beautiful and natural. Avoid shearing plants into hard geometric shapes. Hard shearing prevents blooming, creates panic growth, and increases water use.
- *G* Use organic mulch. It will slowly decompose and improve the organic content of your soil.
- *B* Keep the mulch at least three inches deep to inhibit weed growth and eliminate the need for weed cloth.
- The City of Folsom provides free mulch and compost at two self-serve locations: Behind City Hall at 50 Natoma Street and at Fire Station 36 (next to the sandbag location on Oak Avenue Parkway). Please bring your own shovels and containers.

Monitor Your Water Use

The water meters in the FPA provide access to a program that allows you to monitor your water use down to the hour with the EyeOnWater tool. Sign up at eyeonwater.com.

Conserve Water with Drip Irrigation

- Installing a drip irrigation system is an efficient way to water your landscape.
- Drip systems do not need to run daily. They typically run once or twice a week for longer periods in the summer, less frequently in spring and fall, and not at all in the rainy season.
- Drip systems apply water very slowly and need to run longer and less frequently than lawn sprinklers.
- Make sure to operate your system independently of lawn sprinklers and inspect the system monthly during the watering season.

- Position the emitters to water the root zone, not the base of the plant, and adjust the emitter locations as the plant grows and the root zone expands.
- Check soil moisture before scheduling your drip system to run. If the soil is moist you don't need to water.

Understand Your Soil

- Healthy plants need healthy soil. If your garden is faltering, chemical imbalances in your soil might be preventing your trees and plants from thriving. Ask a landscape professional to conduct a soil analysis to find out what your soil could be lacking.
- Folsom's native soil is primarily clay in texture. However, soil in the Folsom Plan Area may also be comprised of imported fill material with lime and other minerals due to the mass grading that took place during development.
