**SUBJECT: Conditions of Approval: Tree Removal Permit #TREE24-08113**

The City of Folsom Community Development Department (CDD) has reviewed an application for Tree Removal at **1900 Prairie City Rd (Intel Campus)**. The following trees are included in the scope of the application:

The CDD has made the decision to conditionally approve the application based on the following findings:

- The proposal is in conformance with the provisions of FMC 12.16.080(B)(4) – *Use of the property consistent with the zoning code cannot be made unless the protected tree is removed and there are no reasonable alternative measures to allow for use of the property consistent with the zoning code.*

The following condition(s) have been assigned to this permit:

1. The applicant shall mitigate for the fourteen inches (14”) of tree removal in accordance with Folsom Municipal Code 12.16.150 through either the payment of in-lieu fees or the planting of replacement oak trees.
2. The permittee shall defend, protect, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Folsom and its officials, agents, and employees from any and all claims, demands, suits, causes of action, damages, costs, expenses, losses, or liability, in law or in equity, of every kind and nature whatsoever arising out of or in connection with the issuance of the Tree Permit or the permittee’s work performed under the Tree Permit.

The decision on this application is subject to a 10-calendar day appeal period which commences **May 4, 2024** and extends through **May 13, 2024**. Any party dissatisfied with the determination on this application may file an appeal to the CDD Director. Once issued, the tree removal permit is non-transferable.
