9a. Presentation of Zoning Code Standards Regarding Accessory Structures and Direction to Staff

Community Development Director Pam Johns made a presentation and responded to questions from the City Council.

Code Enforcement Officer Pete Piccardo responded to questions from the City Council.

The following speakers addressed the City Council:

Brian Esola, homeowner and treehouse builder, expressed his hope to find a way to preserve the treehouse.

David Lasic, expressed support for the treehouse and spoke of the creativity the City Council has applied to solving problems.

Chris Tarczy, real estate agent in Folsom; shared a story of clients who saw and liked the treehouse, noting that was the kind of amenity they would like.

Peggy Dewey spoke in support of Folsom planning and environment and expressed support of the treehouse.

Natalie Turner expressed support for the treehouse and urged the city to find a way to allow the treehouse to remain.

Community Development Director Pam Johns explained that the city is not allowed to vary from the Health and Safety and the Fire Code. City Attorney Steve Wang clarified a variance is a tool used only if the property has a problem that prevents the owner from using the property in the same manner as other properties.

The City Council discussed the issues of code compliance, building codes, and setting of precedent for other non-conforming uses. In conclusion, it was the City Council's consensus to allow the normal code enforcement process to continue in the issue of the Esola's tree house, and to not pursue citywide zoning code changes at this time.

City Manager Elaine Andersen spoke of the opening of Fire Station No. 39, invited residents to attend the Mayor Cup, Renaissance Faire, and offered closing thanks and congratulations to Robert Goss.
