




Preliminary Budget Schedule







"As-is" Budget Comparison

- (1) What are your top three priorities you would like to begin setting aside funds for in the FY20-21 budget in order to complete the project in a future year?
- Mayor Aquino: Create trust fund for pensions, fund improvements to the central business district, and create transportation infrastructure and traffic calming measures to make the city more bicycle and pedestrian friendly
- Vice-Mayor Sheldon: Allocate \$3 million to park renovation to catch up on deferred maintenance
- Council Member Gaylord: Install one shade structure at Nisenan or Econome Park, add one Battalion Chief in the Fire Department, and allocate additional funding for traffic safety/speeding mitigation such as additional officers and/or investment in technology
- Council Member Howell: Fund additional park maintenance, and budget funds for transportation projects if new Measure A is unsuccessful
- Council Member Kozlowski: Funding to prepare a plan for enhanced public facilities, specifically
 those currently housed at the Folsom municipal complex; including banquet and conference
 spaces, the rodeo venue and new or expanded multi-event indoor and outdoor facilities,
 funding to evaluate partnerships with SMUD or others to green the electrical power supply to
 Folsom residents and businesses, and continue the development of safe pedestrian and bicycle
 commuter pathways and introduce traffic calming/expediting measures like round-a-bouts




(2) If revenues are projected to exceed budgeted expenditures, resulting in a budget surplus, are you more interested in using this money to contribute to the general fund reserve (fund balance) or allocate funds to one-time projects?

- Mayor Aquino: Combination of General Fund reserve, adding a police sub-station in HD parking garage and funding park restoration/maintenance


(4) What is the one area in which the City can focus resources and efforts toward achieving specific results that will make the biggest difference?


(5) Is the current allocation of funding by department still appropriate?

- Mayor Aquino: I think so but would like to explore the response models in the fire department to make sure they are the most efficient.
- Vice-Mayor Sheldon: Allocate cell tower revenue specifically for parks
- Council Member Gaylord: Add Battalion Chief and more funding for traffic safety/speeding mitigation.
- Council Member Howell: May need to relocate funds to Public Works for transportation projects if new Measure A is unsuccessful
- Council Member Kozlowski: Yes. Our continued prioritization of public safety is paramount.
